
Samina has a new job. She works at the school.



She sweeps the floors at the school. "Oh, hello, Samina," says her supervisor, "What time do you finish work today?"




"I finish work at 6 o'clock today," Samina says.

Samina thinks about her schedule. She is busy on Tuesday. She has an appointment at the hospital. "Uhm..." Samina says.




The supervisor doesn't wait. "That's great, Samina," he says quickly, "So we'll see you on Tuesday."




Samina has a problem.
