### Talking about the future

- In English, we have two ways to talk about the future: will and be going to
- For both, we use them with a base verb. This verb doesn't change!
  - It will snow a lot tomorrow.
  - I am going to be late for class this afternoon.
- We can use them to talk about any time in the future tomorrow, this evening, next year, or in 100 years
  - Next weekend, my family is going to go to Chicago.
  - People will live on the moon in the year 2100.

#### Future with will

- To talk about the future with will, just put it in front of the verb
  - They will go to the library tomorrow morning.
- You don't need to change the verb! (No –s, -ing, or –ed)
  - He will study English. NOT He will studies English.
  - Don't change will, either! NOT She wills work today.
- We often use will in a contraction
  - I'll buy a new house next year.
  - She'll visit her grandmother this weekend.
- The negative form is will not (won't)
  - We won't have class on Friday.

### Future with be going to

- You can also use be going to for talking about the future
- Change be for the subject (am, are, or is). Don't change the base verb!
  - I am going to eat dinner at 7:00.
  - We are going to clean the house tomorrow.
  - My sister is going to start university in the fall.
- To make it negative, add not after am/are/is
  - He is not going to look for a job.
- You can also use contractions in the positive or negative
  - You're going to finish your homework.
  - They aren't going to watch a movie tonight.

#### Questions about the future - will

- For asking questions about the future, use will instead of do
  - Will you play basketball with us on Saturday?
- If it is a yes/no question, the first word will be will
  - Will we have English class tonight?
- If you have a question word, it will be the first word
  - When will the meeting start?
  - Where will she live next year?
- Question words who, what, when, where, why, how
- QW + will + subject + main verb + .....

## Questions about the future – be going to

- For yes/no questions, start with am/are/is, then the subject
  - Are you going to come with us to the party?
  - Is your sister going to move to Chicago?
- Put the subject between be and going to
- If you have a question word, it will be the first word
  - What are you going to do this weekend?
  - Where are they going to work next year?
- QW + am/are/is + subject + going to + main verb + ...
