I have a lot of tools I use to help during an emergency.




One of my tools is my headset. My headset lets me answer calls without my hands so that I can use the computer.

I also use the computer to ask for help from firefighters, police officers, and other helpers.




My job moves very fast. I have to do many things at the same time when you call 9-1-1 on your phone.

I will ask, "What type of emergency is this?"




I will also ask "Who needs help?" and "What is happening?"

- your phone number



911 is very serious. You should only use it for emergencies.



What is an emergency? An emergency is when you or someone else is in danger. Some examples are: fire, a stranger coming into your home, or a car accident.



911 operators like me are important helpers in our neighborhoods because we are the first call in an emergency. My job is to keep you safe.
